### BLEDLOW RIDGE HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING CENTRE



After many years of campaigning your Ridgeway West team are delighted that the Bledlow Ridge Household Recycling Centre reopened in January. It is now open five days a week, closing every Wednesday and Thursday. In the winter it will be open 9am-4pm (Oct-Mar) and in the summer 9am-6pm (Apr-Sep).

- This site, like others across
  Buckinghamshire is free of charge to visit
  for Bucks residents, although there are
  costs for disposing of non-household
  waste. Residents need to bring proof of
  address when visiting the site such as:
- council tax statement
- utilitu bill
- Passport
- driving licence

Note, waste permits will be needed if residents are visiting in vans, or want to use trailers. Trade waste is not allowed on site, please find an alternative site. We are sure that residents will understand that those living in Oxfordshire will have to pay to use the site with charges starting from approximately £20 per trip for a small car, and nearer £50-60 for a medium-sized car.

**Cllr Carl Etholen** said, "It has been a long and fraught road to see the recycling centre re-opened and I would like to thank Shade & Robert for their support as well as the numerous Parish Councillors, residents and the late Bill Bendyshe-Brown who have been invaluable. This really was a team effort from everyone involved and we are thrilled to see how well used it has been already."

# £5 MILLION EXTRA FOR OUR ROADS

Following the extreme cold temperatures and excessive rainfall over the last few months we have all seen the impact it has had on our roads. Buckinghamshire Council are already part way through their £100 million roads programme over 4 years, but following the extreme weather have committed an extra £5 million in the short term.

Cllr Robert Carington said, "The extreme weather added to any existing road problems. There are teams out doing immediate, albeit, temporary fixes where needed until the weather improves. With this extra £5million the Council will be able to make additional repairs without impacting the current roads programme."
